EATON ROAD

Please be aware that Eaton Road and the adjoining roads are permit parking zones. The City Council have informed us that traffic wardens will be routinely checking this area and issuing parking penalties and fines. They will also be issuing fines for cars parked on the grass verges.

We request that parents collecting their children at the end of the day do not park outside the school in the no parking zones or block residents' driveways. We politely ask that cars are parked a short distance from the school and arrangements made to meet children further down the road. Parked cars waiting for students outside school are currently adding to the congestion of Eaton Road and hindering the safe passage of our students. We are currently working very hard in conjunction with Norwich City Council, Norfolk County Council, the Police and local residents to make the passage between school and home both safe and accessible. Your support in reducing the congestion will be gratefully received.

ROAD SAFETY

As the nights and mornings get even darker each day, we remind you of the importance of road safety and ask that you ensure your child's bike has lights, is in good working order and also that they are wearing bright or reflective clothing. Recently some local residents and members of the public have expressed concerns about the way some students are riding their bikes to and from school; riding over red lights and allowing other students to ride on their bikes with them for example. We are very concerned by these reports and are particularly anxious to prevent any type of accident occurring. We will hold assemblies regarding safe conduct to and from school. We would be very grateful if you could discuss key road safety issues and appropriate conduct when travelling to school with your children. 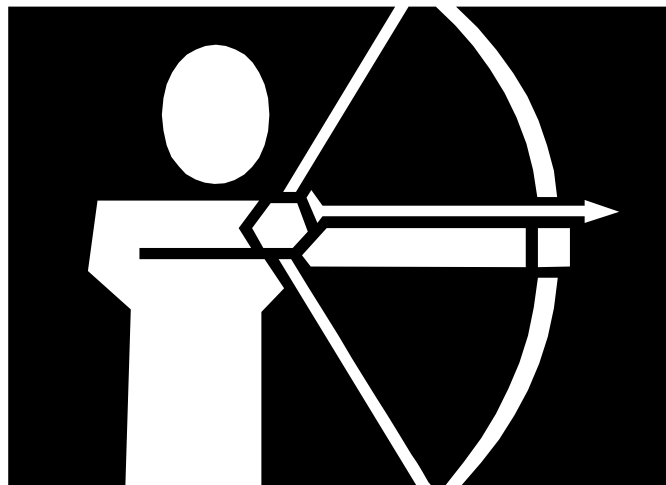
