At 'A' level James Allan was amongst the top ten students nationally in Engineering.

At GCSE there was even more success. In Geography Ben Allen was in the ten highest marks from a cohort of over 20,000. In History Tess Little and Beth Salmon were in the 'top ten' from 26,886.

Amazingly four, Rosie Laudan, Grace Goddard, Nicholas Cordingly and Ben Allen were in the top ten in Religious Studies from an entry of 94,361. This is a truly remarkable achievement and a clear indication that able students flourish at CNS.
