Straight after the break Tom Noble was brought down in the box leaving Henery to convert the spot kick. Kalum Morris then popped up to make it 4-1 with a wonderful strike left footed volley from outside the area leaving the keeper helpless. With CNS now sitting back Hellesdon came on the offensive but a mazy run from Frazer Atherton set up Taylor to net his 2<sup>nd</sup>.
