### RETURN VISIT

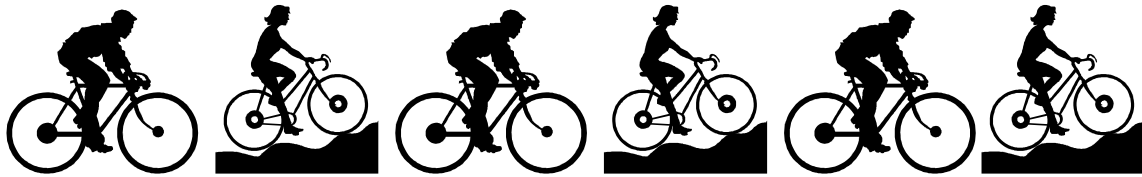
